BATES CREEK CAMP EVENT BEHAVIOR GUIDELINES

Parents, Cabin Leaders, Staff, Participants, and Church Leaders need to be informed of the guidelines that are set forth for activities at Bates Creek Camp Events. We understand that it is not possible, nor do we desire to attempt, to create guidelines for every action. We do, however, give the responsibility to the cabin leaders to ensure that their students are following these guidelines and cooperate with camp leaders to ensure the safety and wellbeing of all those in attendance.

The following list is to help provide general guidelines of conduct. Should there be an issue with the following of these guidelines, we will ask that the cabin leader/staff member responsible discuss this issue and resolve the matter appropriately.

1. Because we believe that all aspects of the program are vital, students will agree to attend and participate in all scheduled activities.
2. We do expect that students will remain on campus for the duration of the entire event. Should an emergency prevent this from happening, the cabin leader will ensure that proper notification is made.
3. Unless special needs are documented with the office, we ask that vehicles are not used on campus except for pre-approved situations. All vehicles on campus will properly display Participation Sticker.
4. So that we might cut down on possible distractions during the event, we ask that those electronic devices used for communication, gaming, playing music, etc., be left at home.
5. Male participants are not allowed in areas that are designated for female participants, and vice versa. We also ask that there be no physical displays of affection between genders.
6. Everyone (staff, cabin leaders, and students) are required to be appropriately dressed at all times. The standard for this is biblical modesty, meaning what you wear does not give an opportunity for the distraction of others. Undergarments should never be visible, and the body should be properly covered at all times. Halter tops, tank tops, muscle shirts, and spaghetti straps are not allowed. Since this is typically a sensitive issue, the cabin leaders are expected to ensure that students are appropriate before exiting the cabin.
7. Dangerous items (weapons, fireworks, etc.) are prohibited on campus.

Regarding Infractions of the guidelines

Cabin Leaders are responsible for ensuring their students are meeting expectations at all times. Should there be concerns, our staff members will resolve the concern with the staff member. Any person violating laws, committing serious infractions, or who are non-compliant with their leaders, will have to leave campus immediately through arrangements made by the appropriate adults.

Regarding Damages

The sending church will be billed for any damages incurred to the camp, facilities, etc.

Regarding Illness/Injury

Students need to report injury/illness to their cabin leader. Cabin Leaders need to report serious illness/injury to the appropriate camp staff (nurse, director, etc.)
